You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.”

We acclaim you, holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new.

And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Father, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and his descent among the dead, proclaiming his resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN: RECAP

Who We Are

We are a community of Episcopalians gathered by Christ, serving and supporting one another and those in need. Our historic church is a living beacon calling all for worship, fellowship, and growth in the grace and knowledge of our Lord. Founded in 1698, the parish continues to meet community needs and rise to challenges of change and growth.

As we contemplate the contemporary needs of individuals in Newport looking for spiritual growth and confronting pressing challenges, we know that we must focus on expanding our services to the community by:

- Expanding our community outreach
- Expanding our programs for children and families
- Making our spaces accessible
- Accommodating our thriving music program

We do not have the space that we need to do these things.

Background

Since 2016 Trinity has been working toward replace outdated facilities on campus. The original plan called for the construction of a building which would be shared by Trinity and various non-profit partners. This plan was modified in 2019 to limit the partners to one, the Newport Community School Aquidneck Island Adult Learning Center. However, in late 2021 it became clear that the Learning Center is growing at a rate that made it impossible for the proposed Trinity building to accommodate their growing needs and those of the church and, consequently, the partnership was dissolved.

Present plans call for constructing a right-sized new building and renovating the kitchen in an existing church building, Honyman Hall. The initial stage is to renovate that kitchen, which has a substantial community focus and use.

This new plan will allow us to continue to use the existing Hawes Room for meals and parish community events, in conjunction with a better functioning kitchen.

Finally, along with other needed repairs to Honyman Hall, we envision moving the choir rehearsal and storage materials into that building's second floor, where the church offices are now.

Goal: Community outreach

Plan: Renovate Honyman Hall kitchen into a commercial kitchen

Cost Estimate: Firm \$150,000

Phase 2

Goal: Accessible offices, children's ministry space and meeting space

Plan: New building

Status: Waiting for completion of new design and review by design committee.

Preliminary electrical infrastructure repairs to begin shortly.

Cost estimate: \$1M budget

Funds Availability: Approximately \$800K available pending pledge payments, minimum of \$200K is left to be raised

Project Execution: Awaiting updated \$1M redesign for design committee/vestry/parish review

Estimated timeline: Construction in 2023

Phase 3

Goal: Provide space for choir rehearsal and music, robes, and equipment storage

Plan: Renovate existing office spaces into a choir room, restore public areas and exterior

Cost Estimate: TBD

Funds Availability: None

Project Execution: In Planning

Executed Timeline: 2024 - 2025
